Would you like to experience the Japanese tradition of tea ceremony? The tea ceremony is the traditional manner of preparing and serving tea based on the spirit of Japanese hospitality. While watching a tea ceremony and drinking tea, you'll hear explanations on manners, tea bowls, and the confection paper and Japanese confectionaries served. You can even participate in a tea ceremony if you like. We hope you will gain a sense of Japanese wabi (austere beauty) and sabi (elegant simplicity), which are integral to the Japanese sense of beauty.





Would you like to learn about ikebana, the art of flower arrangement, which is a key facet of traditional Japanese culture? Ikebana, the art of flower arrangement, is a traditional Japanese art in which plants such as seasonal greenery and flowers are arranged in a traditional vase. You can try creating your own ikebana, and can also take it home with you as a personal souvenir from Japan. The method will be explained in a manner that even beginners can understand.
