

Rules at Evacuation Sites

Each evacuation site will accommodate many evacuees in a limited space. Please make sure to follow the rules below and help each other.

What is an evacuation site?	An evacuation site is a place that temporarily takes in and protects people who cannot continue to live in their homes.
Operation of the evacuation site	The organization based on the unit of community associations takes the lead in operating it. Please make sure to be an active part of the roster to help each other manage and operate the evacuation site.
Rules and manners at the evacuation site	Please help each other.
	Please uphold the rules of life at the evacuation site.
	Please try to be considerate and supportive of such people, including the elderly, those with disabilities, and mothers with infants.
	If you feel sick, please inform the facility staff immediately. If you see another evacuee who looks unwell, please let the staff know.
	Please keep out of restricted areas and rooms with shattered glass all over the floor.
	For foreign nationals, to share information with those who share the same language is recommendable.
Distribution of relief	If you have any problems or questions, please don't hesitate to contact the facility staff.
	Please calmly wait for your turn to come.
	Depending on the situation, infants, children, expectant mothers and those with disabilities are given priority.
	Food is distributed according to a fixed schedule. You need to show your Evacuation Site Registration Card when receiving relief.
	Baby food, powdered infant formula, rice gruel, diapers will be distributed to those in need. Please contact the facility staff if you need any of the items.

Residential space	You will be grouped with your family or by neighborhood association in the residential space.
	Coming back to the site, please remove mud from your shoes. No shoes should be worn in the residential space to maintain sanitation.
	Please take care not to awake other evacuees at night.
About pets	Dogs, cats and other animals are not allowed inside. Pets must be taken care of by the owner at a designated pet area.
Maintain privacy	Please be sure to uphold each other's privacy and don't enter another evacuee's residential space.
Cleaning	All evacuees will assist with cleaning the site to keep the site clean.
	Please sort rubbish accordingly and dispose of them at the specified area.
Use of toilets	Please use the toilets in the manner instructed by the facility including using water buckets to flush toilets.
Fire prevention	Lighting fires and smoking is not permitted in residential spaces. Smoking is allowed only in designated smoking areas.
Use of phones	Please do not talk on the phone in residential spaces, so you don't bother other evacuees.
	Please set your mobile phone to silent mode in residential spaces.
	3 public phones will be installed at an evacuation site. They are used free of charge. One of them is capable of making international calls. Please prevent long telephone calls. Be considerate of others waiting to use the phone.
Closure of evacuation sites	We will notify you before the site closes down.
Other	If you are leaving the evacuation site, please notify the facility staff.
