





Small rechargeable batteries, including **lithium-ion batteries**, that are no longer needed will be collected once a week on **Resource Day**.



For small electronic devices with built-in small rechargeable batteries, remove the battery before disposal. Dispose of the device itself as metal, ceramic, or glass waste. However, do not disassemble power banks or bicycle batteries, but dispose of them as recyclables on Resource Day.

* You can still take them to JBRC-affiliated collection stores.




Deformed or swollen small rechargeable batteries

⇒ **These are extremely dangerous. Please bring them to a waste collection office or waste collection center.**

POINT /

Before disposal, cover the terminals and cable ports with tape to **insulate** them, and place **only the small rechargeable batteries** in a clear plastic bag. * Insulation prevents electrical conductivity.



Items Collectible on Resource Day

What are small rechargeable batteries?

They are batteries that can be recharged and used repeatedly (secondary batteries). They are commonly used in electronic devices that can operate without being plugged in.

Items Not Collectible on Resource Day




- Small electronics items with built-in small rechargeable batteries
⇒ Dispose of them as metal, ceramic, and glass waste.

Examples of products with built-in small rechargeable batteries



Small fans



Wireless earphones



Electronic cigarettes

⇒ **If small rechargeable batteries cannot be removed, please dispose of the item in the areas for metal, ceramic, and glass waste!**

- Car and motorcycle batteries
⇒ Not accepted by Shinjuku City. Contact a specialized disposal service.



- Computers (Note: removed small rechargeable batteries will be collected)



⇒ Dispose of them through certified electronics recyclers in accordance with the Small Home Appliance Recycling Law.


- Items with any side exceeding 30cm
⇒ Please dispose of as oversized waste.

Improper disposal may cause fires

Lithium-ion batteries may overheat or ignite if damaged or handled improperly! When disposing of them on Resource Day, do not mix them with other recyclable resources, such as plastic.
