Rules for Pet Dogs and Cats



There are various rules in Japan for keeping dogs and cats as pets. Please read the following and obey the rules.

Dogs

You must register your dog (Register using either method A or B.)

A Microchipped dogs

- Register through your smartphone ¥400
- Only microchips issued in Japan are acceptable.



B No microchip

- Register at Shinjuku City Public Health Center ¥3,000
- Receive a dog tag and attach it to your dog's collar.



※ If you move out of Shinjuku City, you must reregister with your new municipality.

Daily life rules for pet dogs

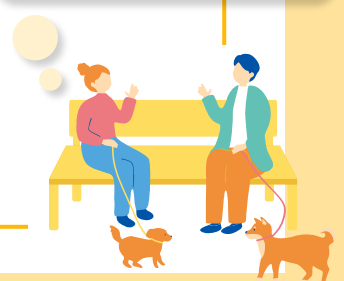
Once a year	1. Get a rabies vaccination at a vet. 	2. Go to Shinjuku City Public Health Center (No need to bring your dog along) What to bring □ Vet-issued vaccination certificate □ ¥550 for a vaccination tag	3. Receive a vaccination tag (¥550) Attach it to your dog's collar
	Daily	• Use poop bags and bring the poop home; rinse pee with water • Dogs are not allowed to run loose outdoors	• Handle barking dogs • Train properly

When walking your dog:

Vaccination tag must be on collar

Leashes are required

Bring poop bags and water to rinse the pee



Cats

Cats do not have to be registered.

Daily life rules for cats

Daily	1. Keep your cat indoors. 	2. Attach a name tag to your cat's collar and have your pet microchipped at a vet. 	3. Cats are very fertile. Have yours spayed or neutered if you do not wish to have kittens.
